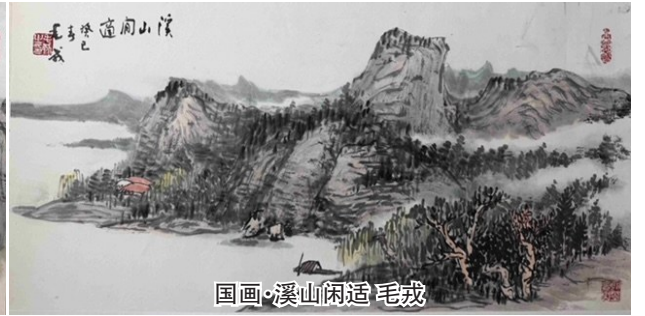

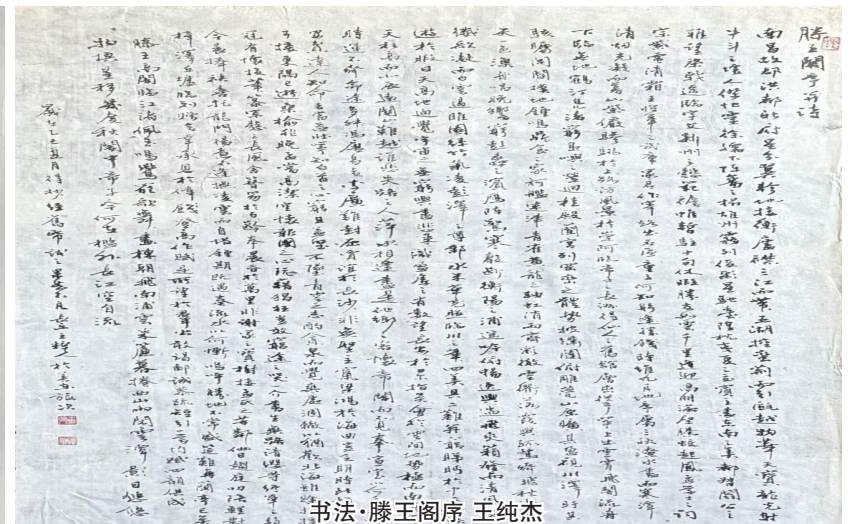
书法·录庾信诗《步虚词》韩辉



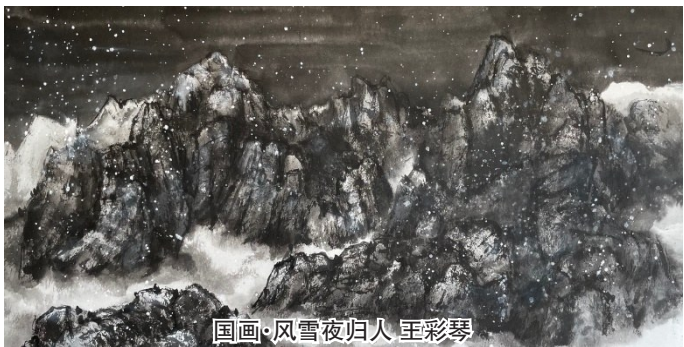

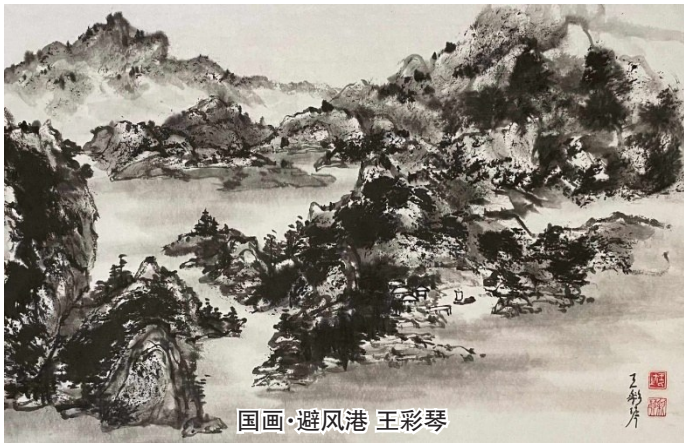

CONNIE CHUNG ORAL HISTORY STUDIO PLANNED Montgomery History to Honor Pioneering Journalist

ROCKVILLE, MD. — When Montgomery History opens its new center in downtown Rockville in September, one of its key features will honor a Montgomery County broadcasting icon.

The Connie Chung Oral History Studio aligns with Montgomery History's mission of showcasing the full diversity of the county's population. Founded in 1944, the organization is in the midst of a \$12 million capital campaign to create the Montgomery History Center, a vibrant hub for local history. The space will house exhibits, lectures, and the Jane Sween Library and Special Collections in the historic Farmers Banking & Trust building at Courthouse Square.

May, which is Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, provides the perfect time to launch the Connie Chung Oral History Studio project. The effort will expand the capacity of the organization's oral history program to actively record stories from county residents representing backgrounds worldwide.

"We are thrilled to partner with a true pioneer of journalism, both locally and nationally," said Matt Logan, Executive Director of Montgomery History.

"This is also an opportunity to recognize the significant contributions of all Asian Americans in the county, who now make up 16 percent of the population. As an Asian American and a woman in a male-dominated field, Connie Chung opened doors for her generation and all who came after. This new studio, named for her, will help us preserve precious stories from this and all other communities in our county for future generations."

Chung attended Montgomery Blair High School in Silver Spring and the University of Maryland, College Park. She was not only the first woman to co-anchor the CBS Evening News, but also the first Asian American to anchor any network news program. Her 2024 autobiography Connie: A Memoir is a New York Times bestseller. Born in 1946, Chung's parents and four older sisters immigrated to the U.S. from China. She has shared that her father gave her an unusual mission early on: to carry on the family surname as males traditionally do—essentially to be the son her parents never had.

"I am honored and flattered to be part of this great tribute to Montgomery County," said Chung. "It has been a privilege to live in the county, and now, to

be recognized in such a meaningful way, is beyond my wildest dreams."

The Montgomery History Center will open on September 6, 2026, marking the county's historic 250th anniversary. Montgomery County was founded just months after the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

Lily Qi, the first immigrant Chinese-American elected to the Maryland General Assembly, and Ariyan Ong, a Rockville-based Asian American civil rights leader, will lead awareness and fundraising efforts for the Chung Studio.

"Connie Chung is a cultural icon," said Qi. "When I first came to America as an international student, she was practically the only Asian face I saw on television. Her example was inspiring and showed us what is possible in America."

The Chung Studio will bring to life the countless stories that embody the rich diversity of Montgomery County.
